- There are two days camps being run by the Minsi Trails Council in 2025
 - Minsi Camp or northern will be held Monday, June 30 through Thursday, July 3, 2025, at Camp Minsi in Pocono Summit, Pa
 - Unami Camp or southern will be held Monday, August 4 through Thursday, August 7, 2025, at Indian Trail Park in Northampton, Pa
 - ➤ Both camps will begin with check in at 8AM and end with pick up at 4PM each day of the camps.
- Both camps are open to youth ages 5-11, boy and girl. They do not need to be registered in the Scouting program to attend but it is greatly encouraged. Go to <u>beascout.org</u> for additional information on Scouting in your area.
- Lunches will be provided as part of the Minsi Camp day and included in the fee. Please complete
 the dietary needs/restriction portions of the registration so that meals can be planned accordingly.
- Lunches for the Unami Camp will not be provided and not included in the fee and will be the responsibility of the participants.
- Each youth participant and volunteer will be given one event tee shirt and it is requested that they be worn every day of the event. Additional shirts will be available for purchase at the event.
- Each participant and volunteer will also be given a wristband identifying them as participants of the event.
- Adult and youth volunteers will be required to provide clearances as per PA Act 15 and be
 registered with Scouting America prior to the camps. Emails detailing that process will be sent to

- Scouting Medical forms are required for all Scouting events for all attending, youth and adults, and can be found at <u>camp med forms</u>.
- Bring a friend day will be the last day of camp. Each youth participant is encouraged to bring a friend of similar age at no additional cost.
- Lion (5 years old or Kindergarten) and Tiger (6 years old or 1st grade) youth are required to have a parent or guardian accompany them the entire duration of camp. These adults are not considered volunteers unless they register as such and complete and submit the necessary paperwork prior to attending camp.
- Both camps will have aquatic-based activities so youth should be prepared with proper attire for swimming. Private changing areas will be provided.
