Activities:

National Summertime Award – Cub Scouts

Just because school classrooms go dark in the summer doesn't mean Cub Scouting has to. Extend the fun of Cub Scouting into the year's hottest season by earning the National Summertime Pack Award (http://www.scouting.org/scoutsource/Awards_Central/NationalSummertime.aspx).

To qualify for the National Summertime Pack Award, a pack must hold at least one pack event or activity in each of the three months – June, July, and August. There is no attendance requirement to earn the pack award. Do that, and you'll get a streamer for your pack flag and a certificate suitable for framing. Dens with an average attendance of at least half their members at the three summer pack events are eligible for a colorful den participation ribbon.

Scouts and adults who participate in all three events are eligible to receive the National Summertime Pack Award pin, which they can wear on the right pocket flap of their uniform. Attending summer camp and day camp counts.

National Outdoor Awards Program – Scouts BSA

Do you enjoy camping under the stars, rafting a whitewater river, or hitting the trail afoot, on a bike, or even on a horse? Can you pitch a tent, find your way, and bandage an ankle using only materials in your pack? Are you prepared to do any of these in rain, snow, sleet, or heat? If so, the National Outdoor Awards are for you. There is nothing virtual about these awards—you can earn them only by demonstrating knowledge and experience in the outdoors. So, if you are a member of Scouts BSA, Sea Scout, or Venturer, and think you are tough and disciplined enough to hike or ride the miles, camp the nights, run the rivers or lakes, or do the work to conserve the land, then read on and see if the National Outdoor badges or possibly the National Medal for Outdoor Achievement could be for you!

National Outdoor Awards for Camping, Aquatics, Conservation, Hiking, Riding, and Adventure

When a Scout excels in outdoor participation, there are awards to show for it! This program, conceived by the BSA's National Camping Task Force, includes a series of six badges designed to recognize a Scout, Sea Scout, or Venturer who has exemplary knowledge and experience in performing high-level outdoor activities.

The award consists of up to six emblem segments positioned around the perimeter of a beautiful center emblem. All are embroidered in full color. The segments represent six areas of emphasis: Camping, Aquatics, Conservation, Hiking, Riding, and Adventure, with rigorous requirements to earn each segment.

What Wood Badge Did for Me

When some Scouting friends convinced me to take Wood Badge, I thought that it would be a repeat of the knowledge I already gained after years of staffing our youth-oriented NYLT course. In fact, I thought the only difference between the courses was the addition of a "ticket" that seemed like it had its own lofty requirements. Despite knowing parts of the course and hearing what others had mentioned, I was still going in blind, and I wouldn't have changed it if I could.



The course didn't feel like I was attending a two-weekend seminar on leadership training. Instead, Wood Badge rekindled my excitement and enthusiasm when attending NYLT fourteen years prior. The knowledge coupled with activities brought

a different perspective to the skills I had learned. During the weekends, I was often taken by surprise given how energized the staff were and how well the course was catered to adult Scouters.

I felt enlightened when I saw how the material could be applied both within Scouting and my professional career. After the course, I saw connections to how my managers com-



municated especially in difficult situations. Much of what I saw on Wood Badge became more apparent and gave me the opportunity to put those skills into practice. I couldn't imagine the skills taught on a course that I helped staff for so many years becoming more relevant to me when seeing it through a different perspective.
