




Hello Northampton District Scouters,

Fall recruiting season is upon us, and I hope you all are taking advantage of the many opportunities to coordinate joining nights and school flyers to help in that effort. The council also has some equipment available that could help make these events enjoyable for the scouts. Please feel free to share any questions you may have. Thank you.

I wanted to take a moment and address the upcoming membership fee beginning for the year 2026. Unfortunately, our family Friends of Scouting (FOS) contributions have declined to a level that made this action necessary. Overall, with the decline in the number of scouts and subsequent scout families, contributions have dropped to a level where it is affecting our council budgets. As an offset to the fees, as stated in letters that were sent out, Minsi Trails is still offering the Camp Minsi summer camp discount to council Scouts. In addition, certain district and council events will no longer carry an activity fee. These events will be clearly defined in the coming months. In cases where there are financial hardships, please know that our council will make accommodations as needed. This was a hard decision to make, but in light of the reduced financial support, it was necessary. Even with these new fees, in my mind, scouting is still the best activity for our youth.

Membership News

New Recharter Fee

The council board has approved a \$65 renewal fee. All Scouts with an anniversary date of December 2025 and beyond will be charged a \$65 Council fee to renew their membership. This is in addition to the \$85 National fee. This does not affect Scouts who have a renewal date prior to December this year. It also will not affect youth who join Scouting before December. Volunteers are not impacted by this fee. Council will stop the Friends of Scouting presentations at the end of 2025. Donations are always welcome.

Recharter Reminder

Units are asked to begin checking PA clearances and Youth Protection Training before we begin the recharter process. In addition, if you have volunteers who are changing positions, please make sure you make the changes before recharter. It can be completed via Scoutbook by your unit Chartered Organization Representative or their designated representative.

BeAScout Pin

Units, please review your BeAScout pin to make sure that the information is up to date. Verify contact information, meeting location, day, and times that you meet. *Make sure your pin is turned on.*

BeAScout Leads

Units, when you receive an email through BeAScout please reach out to the family and address any questions they may have. Invite them to a meeting so they can see your unit at work and meet the Scouts and leaders. We ask that you make a note on the invitation to let us know that the family has been contacted and the results of the contact. These leads are an excellent opportunity to grow your unit.


Scouts BSA Interpreter Strip

With fall comes back to school. Scouts taking a foreign language, this is an excellent opportunity to earn your Interpreter strip. Adults and Scouts BSA are eligible for this strip. Below are the requirements. Thank you, Troop 302, for reminding us.

Overview

To signify that a youth or adult member speaks a foreign language (one other than English)

French; German; Spanish; signing; Dutch; Italian; Portuguese; Russian; Cantonese (Chinese; Greek; Japanese; Simplified Mandarin (Chinese); Traditional Mandarin (Chinese); Vietnamese,; American Sign Language; Hebrew; Morse Code.



Any member who speaks a specific foreign language; demonstrate knowledge by carrying on a five-minute conversation in this language, translating a two-minute speech or address, and writing a letter in the language (does not apply for sign language); or, translating 200 words from the written word.

Requirements

Youth and adults may wear this strip if they show their knowledge of a foreign language or sign language by:

- 1. Carrying on a five-minute conversation in this language.
- 2. Translating a two-minute speech or address.
- 3. Writing a letter in the language (does not apply for sign language).
- 4. Translating 200 words from the written word.

MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL REMINDERS

Beginning August 1st, Scouting America will start sending text message reminders to members about upcoming membership renewals.

Texts will be sent 45 days before your membership expires
A sample reminder is included so you'll recognize it when it arrives
These messages are designed to help you stay current; no missed deadlines!

Important Update for Parents/Guardians in Scoutbook Plus

If you're a parent or guardian not currently connected to your child in Akela (the national membership system), you will begin seeing warning messages in Scoutbook Plus.

Why it matters:

These connections must be validated by December 31, 2025
If not updated, your access will be limited, and you may not be able to complete registrations or renewals

What to do:

A pop-up message will provide step-by-step instructions to validate your relationship.

Scouting through the ages...



Cub Scouts is a youth program for boys and girls in kindergarten through fifth grade. It focuses on building character, developing leadership skills, promoting good citizenship, and encouraging personal fitness—all through fun, hands-on activities. Children participate in small groups called dens, working on age-appropriate adventures that include outdoor activities, crafts, games, and community service. The program is family-friendly and designed to help young kids grow into responsible, confident individuals.

Scouts BSA is a program for youth ages 11 to 17, open to both boys and girls in separate troops. It builds on the foundation of Cub Scouts and focuses on developing leadership, outdoor skills, citizenship, and personal responsibility. Scouts plan their own activities, go camping, explore a variety of skills and interests through merit badges, and work toward rank advancement. The program emphasizes youth-led experiences, teamwork, and community involvement.





Sea Scouts is a co-ed program for youth ages 14 to 21 who are passionate about water-based adventures and leadership. This program supplements or extends the Troop experience. Sea Scouts offers hands-on experiences in boating, water safety, seamanship, and any and all water-based adventures. Sea Scout units—called "ships"—operate on oceans, rivers, lakes, and bays across the country, providing opportunities to sail, scuba dive, navigate, kayak, whitewater raft and use SUPs.. Beyond the water, the program fosters citizenship, teamwork, and personal growth through outdoor activities, service projects, and leadership training.

Venturing is a co-ed youth development program for young people ages 14 to 20. This program <u>supplements or extends</u> the Troop experience. Venturing is designed to foster adventure, leadership, personal growth, and service through high-energy outdoor activities and real-world challenges. Venturing crews—small groups led by youth with adult advisors—plan and execute their own experiences, which can include hiking, rock climbing, community service, and more. The program follows the ALPS model: *Adventure, Leadership, Personal Growth*, and *Service*, helping teens build confidence, character, and lifelong skills.
