Who can participate?	The Minsi Trails Council STEM Camp program is open to any registered Scout, Venturer or Explorer (boys and girls ages 10 to 20).				
Do Scouts attend with their troop/crew/post or as individuals?	This program is designed for Scouts to register and attend as individuals (although they can sign-up with a buddy or two from their home unit). Participants will be placed into a fully-staffed provisional patrol for the week, living and learning alongside other youth with shared interests.				
Where will I be staying?	Participants will be staying in our summer camp campsites. Each site is equipped with standard BSA canvas tents on raised wooden platforms. Tents hold two cots. Each site also includes a comfort station with private latrine facilities and running water.				
What should I bring to camp?	Any good Scout should "be prepared" and bring the necessary items when they go camping. A suggested list of things to bring to STEM Camp can be found on Page 2 of this guide. An Annual BSA Medical Form (Parts A, B, and C) will also be need upon you arrival at camp.				
Are there additional costs for any of the activities?	No, all of the program expenses and supplies are built-in to the camp fees for this specialty camp. However participants may want to bring some extra spending money for souvenirs and treats at the camp trading post throughout the week.				
Are there prerequisite requirements for any of the merit badges?	No, due to the expert teachers and special opportunities being offered during this week, there are no additionally pre-requisites for any of the badges. However Scouts should bring a "blue card" (signed by their Scoutmaster) for each badge they plan on earning.				
Aside from merit badges, what other awards can I earn?	Working with the STEM Camp staff at our special evening workshops, Scout will be able to complete one of the BSA's five Nova awards and begin on the path towards earning the Boy Scouts of America's prestigious Supernova Award.				
Can I attend as a day camper?	Yes, a day camp option is available. Scouts should arrive on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday at 8:45am and should be picked-up at 5:00PM when merit badge instruction is completed. Lunch is included. Scouts doing the day camp option will not participate in the evening Nova workshops.

Check-In:

Scouts should arrive at Camp Minsi between 2PM and 3PM on Sunday. They will be directed to check-in at the Administration Building just off the parking lot. The office check-in will review their registration and that payment has been received. After checking in at the Administration Building, a staff guide will take you to the Health Lodge for a medical check. All participants must turn in a completed BSA Annual Health and Medical Record (parts A, B and C). Scouts will then be led to their campsite to unload gear and get settled into a tent.

Check-Out:

The STEM Camp program concludes on Wednesday with our closing ceremonies in the Parade Field at 5:45PM, followed by a camp-wide picnic barbeque dinner. Parents and families coming to pick-up their Scouts are invited to attend the closing ceremonies and the picnic. Scouts can pick-up their blue cards, check-out and depart between 6:30PM and 7:30PM on Wednesday evening.

- 4. Click on "Troop Roster".
- 5. Click on appropriate "Scout".
- 6. Click on "Scout Advancement".
- 7. Go to the bottom of the page.
- 8. Click on "Start another Merit Badge".
- 9. Click on "Start a Merit Badge".



10. Click on the appropriate Merit Badge from the list.

DO STEPS 4 THROUGH 10 FOR ALL THE SCOUTS/ MERIT BADGES FOR WHICH BLUE CARDS ARE NEEDED

- 11. Click on "My Dash board".
- 12. Click on "Unit".
- 13. Click on "Print Blue Cards".
- 14. Set dates.
- 15. Click on "Update Filter".
- 16. Click on print on blank 8.5x11 paper "BOX".

Minsi Trails Council Family,

Earlier this week the National Council of the Boy Scouts of America announced an increase to national membership fees based upon rising operating costs. Effective August 1, 2023, the national membership fee for youth members will increase by \$5/year and the national membership fee for adults will increase by \$15/year. Merit Badge Counselors not already registered in a Scouting position will be required to pay a national annual fee of \$25. Additionally, as of September 1, 2023, adults staying overnight in connection with any Scouting activity must be currently registered. The national, one-time new member joining fee of \$25 for program participants in Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturing and Sea Scouts remains in place. The BSA Unit Recharter Fee (which is also a national fee) will remain unchanged.

It is important to note the National Membership Fee, Joining Fee, and Unit Recharter Fee are all National BSA fees and none of these funds stay with our local Scouting program in Minsi Trails. Unlike all neighboring councils, Minsi Trails does not charge local program, insurance, or service fees to participants.

Please see the attached Infographic for additional information about the new national fee structure.

BSA National also announced that beginning August 1, 2023, all new youth and adult members who join Scouting will be enrolled in a 12-month membership cycle and BSA will cease prorating fees. Both youth and adults will pay the full annual membership fee and will renew their membership on their anniversary date. All proration of membership fees will be eliminated. Registered members of the BSA will receive an email notice with a registration renewal link 60 days before the anniversary date they joined Scouting. Unit leaders will receive a copy of the email and should stay engaged in the membership renewal process just like rechartering. We will share additional details on the process when they become available from the National Office.

We recognize these fee increases may be difficult for some Scouting families and encourage them to use the annual Fall Popcorn Sale as a way for Scouts to earn their own way. We encourage Scouting Units and Sponsoring Organizations to help support Scouting families in need. Minsi Trails Council also has funds available to help support Scouts and families with the greatest financial needs. If you have a Scout that is truly in need, please have them contact their District Executive to apply for financial assistance.

The Scouting program remains one of the most valuable investments we can make in today's youth. Our dedicated volunteers, staff, and families make the Scouting program possible. Thank you for continuing to make a difference in the lives of the youth we serve.

What is driving the youth and adult national membership fee increase?

- General Liability Insurance costs to protect volunteer leaders, staff, charter organizations, units, and youth.
- BSA restructuring costs.
- Enhanced Criminal Background check processes and investments in Youth protection and safety programs.

What steps has the National Service Center taken to manage costs?

- Completed a new staff structure and streamlined both the professional workforce and the volunteer structure, while maintaining essential services.
- Reduced the National staff workforce to support essential services.
- Reduced expenses throughout the National organization.

What is the new national membership fee for youth and adults? Will the fees go up again?

- The new adult national membership fee is \$60, and the youth national membership fee is \$80 annually.
- The BSA will continue to evaluate the national membership fees and keep our councils and unit leaders informed of any further changes to the fee structure.

What benefits and services are provided to the unit with the national registration fee?

- Expanded General Liability Insurance protections for the chartered organization and unit leaders in the event of an incident.
- Program research and development including, Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, Venturing and Exploring.
- Access to Youth Protection Training, Incident Reporting and Scouts First Helpline: 1-844-Scouts1.
- Access to leadership specific training for adult leaders.
- Investments in program literature and resource development.
- Ability to purchase Uniforms, Insignia and Recognition for youth and Adults.
- Provides access to Membership, Marketing, and Brand Center resources.
- Provides important technology support including Scout Book, on-line registration, on-line advancement, and rechartering, My. Scouting, BeAScout, and BSA Brand Center for digital assets.
- Access to the four BSA High Adventure Properties including Philmont Scout Ranch, Florida Sea Base, Northern Tier High Adventure Base, and the Summit Bechtel Reserve.
