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NOTES FROM THE DISTRICT CHAIR

Hello Northampton District scouters.

As per Punxsutawney Phil, we should have turned the corner and our weather should be brightening in the coming weeks. Let's hope he's right. I have three items I would like to touch on in this month newsletter.

The first is a thank you to all the scouts and especially their leaders who made the trek up to Camp Minsi for a wonderful scout Klondike derby and Webelos Winter event. The weather mostly cooperated but was a little chilly when the wind decided to kick up. A huge thank you to Chris Fluke and his Klondike team of volunteers, as well as Ashley Leeper and her team of Winter event volunteers for all of their time, effort, and enthusiasm. There were over 200 scouts of various age groups participating in scout skills and learning. All in all, two great events.

Next on my agenda is membership. All of the press over the past five or so years, in addition to the impact Covid had, has decimated the number of young people involved in scouting. But our mission hasn't changed and the need for our young people to be involved learning skills they will use in their lifetime, from caring adults who are fulfilling the scout oath in their lives by helping others has not changed. We all need to collectively invite youth to consider scouting. But just as importantly, relay to new parents the benefits for our children that we all see through our years of scouting. Word-of-mouth sharing is free and has always been found to be the most effective. Please reach out and make the invitation. If everyone invites 10 people and only 10% say yes we can build our ranks by 1,000 new scouts. And with new scouts come new adult volunteers. Please help spread the benefits of Scouting!

The last topic is our Family Friends Of Scouting (FOS) season! Many people do not realize that the re-charter registration fees collected all go to the National Council to support the Scouting framework and structure as well as insurances. Our local Minsi Trails Council needs to raise its own funds to operate our local framework and support the professional staff. Some funds come from our Council camps, some from events like the annual Leadership Dinner, golf tournament, and so on. Some comes from local foundations. One other key source is our Family FOS program. Unit personnel and District personnel conduct short presentations at a Unit event (Pack Meeting, Court of Honor, Blue and Gold, etc...) and ask for financial support from individuals within our Scout family. These presentations, and the funds raised, are a necessity to keep our Council functioning. For those who have set a date, and/or have had a presentation already, thank you!

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Membership News

Attention All Units

Northampton District has received a grant which will pay registration fees for one year for any new Scout that joins your unit. In addition, the Scout will receive a \$50 credit at the Scout Shop. In order to receive these funds units must have the Scout complete a paper application and turn it in to either Mike Borgman or Melissa Mohr. This is an excellent initiative to help in recruiting new Scouts to your unit. *Do Not accept online applications!* We also have a grant for new Scouts who join and have a Nazareth mailing address. The same applies for these Scouts as well. *Again, paper applications only!*

PA Clearances

The Pennsylvania Act 15 law requires all units and Charter Organizations in addition to Council maintain a copy of all registered adult clearances. This includes Child Abuse, Criminal history, and FBI fingerprint or waiver. We recommend that you ask each adult for a copy of their clearances and make sure that your chartered organization also retains a copy. We suggest that you get a binder and clear inserts to keep the information safe. If you have any questions, please contact Patti Davis at davispr91@outlook.com.

We ask that each unit review the awards. Please nominate a candidate from your unit for the District Scouting Spirit Award. BeAScout Pin

Units, please review your BeAScout pin to make sure that the information is up to date. Verify contact information, meeting location, day, and times that you meet. Make sure your pin is turned on.

BeAScout Leads

Units when you receive an email through BeAScout please reach out to the family and address any questions they may have. Invite them to a meeting so they can see your unit at work and meet the Scouts and leaders. We ask that you make a note on the invitation to let us know that the family has been contacted and the results of the contact. These leads are an excellent opportunity to grow your unit. Don't forget to let them know that there are funds available to cover the cost of the first-year registration and towards the purchase of a uniform, etc. at the Scout Shop.

New Charter Fees

National fees for new and existing Scouts and leaders are effective as of April 1, 2024. National has done away with the \$25 new Scout joining fee. See the attached fee information.

72 Hour Rule

As you are aware, the 72-hour rule expired on September 1, 2023. What does this mean for your unit? Any adult who attends a **Troop** overnight activity will be required to be a registered adult. That can be as an Assistant Scoutmaster, a member of your unit committee, or an adult program participant; **this applies to Scout BSA units only**. Cub Scout exceptions are listed below.

Volunteers who help at fundraisers, community service and/or Eagle projects do not need to be registered. However there **always** needs to be at least 2 registered adults at these events. See details below:

The following is from the Guide to Safe Scouting under Youth Protections & Adult Leadership section (https://www.scouting.org/health-and-safety):

Registration Requirements

The chartered organization representative, or in their absence the executive officer of the chartered organization, must approve the registration of the unit's adult leaders.

Registration includes:

- Completion of application including criminal background check and mandatory Youth Protection training
- Volunteer Screening Database check

Current Youth Protection training is required for leaders when renewing their registration or at unit charter renewal.

Adult program participants must register as adults and follow Youth Protection policies.

Adult Supervision

(Effective September 1, 2023) Two registered adult leaders 21 years of age or over are required at all Scouting activities, including all meetings. There must be a registered female adult leader 21 years of age or over in every unit serving females. A registered female adult leader 21 years of age or over must be present for any activity involving female youth or female adult program participants.

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Notwithstanding the minimum leader requirements, age and program-appropriate supervision must always be provided.

All adults staying overnight in connection with a Scouting activity must be currently registered as an adult volunteer or an adult program participant. Adult volunteers must register in the position(s) they are serving in. Registration as a merit badge counselor position does not meet this requirement. See FAQ (https://www.scouting.org/health-and-safety/yp-faqs/) for list of approved adult registration fee required positions. Limited exception below for Cub Scout overnight Programs.

Cub Scout Programs – Overnight Exception: Cub Scout parents or legal guardians taking part in an overnight Cub Scout program with their own child or legal ward are not required to register as leaders. All adults must review the "How to Protect your Children from Child Abuse: A Parent's Guide" that can be found in the front of each Cub Scout Handbook or online at https://www.scouting.org/training/youth-protection/parents-guides/. In addition, the parent or legal guardian must be accompanied by a registered leader at any time they are with youth members other than their own child/ward. All other overnight adults must be currently registered in an adult fee required position. (End Effective September 1, 2023 Update)

We strongly recommend that any parent who attends an outing with your unit take Youth Protection Training.

Keep in mind that any adult who registers in a position will also need to provide all Pennsylvania clearances in addition to the Youth Protection training as well as any requirements associated with your Charter Organization.

Cub Scout Rank Advancement Changes Coming June 2024

Scouts BSA Interpreter Strip

For Scouts taking a foreign language in school, this is an excellent opportunity to earn your Interpreter strip. Adults and Scouts BSA are eligible for this strip. Below are the requirements. Thank You Troop 302 for reminding us.

Overview

To signify that a youth or adult member speaks a foreign language (one other than English)

French; German; Spanish; signing; Dutch; Italian; Portuguese; Russian; Cantonese (Chinese); Greek; Japanese; Simplified Mandarin (Chinese); Traditional Mandarin (Chinese); Vietnamese; American Sign Language; Hebrew; Morse Code.

Who Can Earn This Award?

Any member who speaks a specific foreign language; demonstrate knowledge by carrying on a five-minute conversation in this language, translating a two-minute speech or address, and writing a letter in the language (does not apply for sign language); or, translating 200 words from the written word.

Requirements

Youth and adults may wear this strip if they show their knowledge of a foreign language or sign language by:

- 1. Carrying on a five-minute conversation in this language.
- 2. Translating a two-minute speech or address.
- 3. Writing a letter in the language (does not apply for sign language).
- 4. Translating 200 words from the written word.

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2023-24 MINSI TRAILS COUNCIL PINEWOOD DERBY RULES

<u>INSPECTION:</u> Each car must pass inspection by the official inspection committee before it may compete. The car is to be held by the scout NOT THE PARENT as you prepare for inspection and throughout the race. The inspectors will disqualify those cars which cannot be made to meet these specifications. The race committee will hold cars that pass inspection until the race and inspect the winning cars following the race.

<u>JUDGES</u>: The decision of the judges on race day is final. Pinewood cars not meeting rule requirements will be permitted to race but <u>WILL NOT</u> be eligible for trophies! Questions and polite discussion will be allowed up to the point of a decision by the judges. Failure to follow this rule may lead to the disqualification of the car involved by the judges. At the discretion of the judges persons may be ejected from the premises of the race for behavior they deem disruptive, unsportsman-like, or un-scout-like.

ATTACHMENTS: The car must be freewheeling with no starting devices.

<u>AXLE CHANNEL:</u> The BSA Pinewood Block's pre-cut slots must be used for the axels. The channel or groove designed to hold the axle must not be filled-in. The judge must be able to inspect the axle. If axles are loose secure them with transparent glue.

<u>AXLES:</u> Only the nails supplied with the kit are permitted. They must be mounted in the wood grooves only. The axles may be glued in place with transparent glue. They may be polished or lubricated but not machined or narrowed. Full length axles that can be purchased at hobby shops ARE NOT PERMITTED.

<u>DETAILS:</u> Details such as Steering Wheels, Driver Decals, Painting, etc. are permitted as long as these details do not exceed the maximum length, width and weight specifications.

HEIGHT: The bottom of the car must clear the guide strip (3/8") on the track. The car may not be more than 3" high.

HUBCAPS: No type of hubcap is permitted. This includes decals.

LENGTH: Overall length shall not exceed 7".

LUBRICATION: Dry Lubrication only is permitted. ABSOLUTELY NO ADDITIONAL LUBRICATION PERMITTED AFTER INSPECTION!

<u>NEW CAR:</u> A new car must be built each year. Pre-cut cars that can be purchased at hobby shops ARE NOT PERMITTED! Scouts must use the Grand Prix Pinewood Derby kit.

NOSE OF CAR: The nose must extend beyond the leading edge of the front wheel; however, no portion of the car can extend past the starting gate / peg.

SPRINGING: The car shall not ride on any type of springs or suspension.

<u>WEIGHT:</u> Weight shall not exceed 5.0 ounces. No loose materials of any kind are permitted in the car. The car may be hollowed out and built up to the maximum weight by the addition of wood or metal -provided that it is securely built into the body. Electronic scales will be used for the weight check.


WHEEL BASE: (Length) Length of wheel base (front axle to rear axle) must be within the limits of 4 1/2" maximum and 4 1/4" minimum (essentially, the distance provided by the grooves precut into the supplied wood block).

WHEEL BASE: (inside) Do not make the distance between the left and right wheels narrower than 1 3/4 " or the car will not run down the track.


WHEEL BEARINGS: Bearings, washers, or other types of bushings are NOT permitted.

<u>WHEELS:</u> Only BSA licensed Grand Prix Wheels may be used. Wheels must have "BSA" printed on them from the manufacturer. BSA - Black, Red, Yellow, Blue, Green, Pink, Purple, Orange and Glow-in-the-dark are only wheels permitted. Alterations to the wheels are not permitted - the wheels may not be cut, drilled, beveled or rounded. The shape must remain the same. The plastic flashing may be removed (outside edge). All 4 wheels <u>must</u> make contact with the track surface (this is tested by free rolling the car). Wheel surfaces must remain flat with full tread contact and cannot ride on edges or they WILL NOT pass inspection!

WIDTH: Overall width shall not exceed 2 3/4 ".

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Advancement Updates 2024

As of January 1, 2024, the following changes to Scouts BSA requirements become effective.

Rank Requirements:

There were minor changes to Scout (6), and Star (6).

The Cyberchip has been phased out. Scouts should use the Personal Safety Awareness training at https://www.scouting.org/training/youth-protection/scouts-bsa/ for both Scout and Star ranks.

Eagle Palms:

Scouts BSA will no longer have to wait three months between Eagle Palms. They will have to earn five additional merit badges, and live by the Scout Oath and Law.

Merit badge with significant changes to content are:

- Automotive Maintenance updated to include electric/hybrid vehicles (1c,d,e,f,g,h) (2a,b,c,d,e) (3c) (8a,e,f)
- Canoeing major reorganization (3) (4b) (7) (8) (9)
- Coin Collecting reorganization and updated for new/retired coinages (3) (4) (5) (6) (7)
- Fire Safety safety updates (1c) (2) (4) (6b,c,d,g) (7a) (9a) (10a) (11)
- First Aid*– more hands-on (2) (4) (7) (8d) (10) (11) (12) (13) (14) (15) (16)
- Golf reorganized and added disc golf option (1) (2)

Over the past several years the National Cub Scouting Committee under the leadership of past chair Lisa Wylie and current chair Audrey Oakes has identified four areas to improve the Cub Scout program to ensure that it is fun, simple, and easy.

Over the past five years the National Cub Scouting has been working on these updates. These updates are based on feedback from over 23,000 parents and Cub Scout leaders through various surveys and data. Listening to and identify the key opportunities to improve the program the National Cub Scout committee is excited to finally reveal these improvements. Over the past year these improvements have been socialized to thousands of individuals with overwhelming support.

The four areas of improvement are the Bobcat badge, Cub Scout Adventures, Webelos, and Cub Scout Awards.

Bobcat will no longer be a badge that is earned once when a Cub Scout joins. It will become a required Adventure for each rank and earned each year. The requirements for the Bobcat Adventure are different for each grade to make them age-appropriate. -17-

Cub Scout Badges of Rank
Requirements

The Bobcat Adventure is designed to be the first required Adventure.

Each badge of rank is earned by completing six required and two elective Adventures.

The six required Adventures are focused on the aims and focus areas of the BSA.



Cub Scout Adventures have been improved to make it easier to deliver the program to multi-rank dens or as a Pack. To earn each rank in Cub Scouting will require a Cub Scout to earn the six required Adventures and two elective Adventures. Required Adventures reflect the aims and focus areas of the BSA. The number of elective Adventures increases.

Webelos and Arrow of Light will be separated. Webelos becomes the 4th-grade program in Cub Scouting. Arrow of Light becomes a stand-alone badge of rank for 5th graders and will no longer be associated with Webelos. Arrow of Light will be the program that prepares Cub Scouts to join Scouts BSA.

Cub Scouts Awards will be reimagined as Cub Scout Adventures. Topics like camping, STEM, and range and target sports will remain and are reimagined into elective Adventures that can be used towards earning a badge of rank.

The changes will take effect officially on June 1, 2024.

NOMINATIONS NEEDED BY APRIL 1

FOR

District Fellowship Award

The Northampton District Fellowship Award is presented annually by the Northampton District to encourage participation at a level of service beyond that of a Unit, or, for long term service to a Unit. The award is available to adult Scouters who render service of an outstanding nature for the District, or, for long-term dedication and service of an outstanding nature for a Unit. The nominee must have rendered noteworthy service to youth. Consideration should be given to the nominee's position and the corresponding opportunity to render outstanding service beyond the expectation of duty. A nominee's attitude and cooperation with the District/Unit is to be taken into consideration. The nominee should exhibit an attitude of fellowship and helpfulness to all Scouters in Unit/District. This award is normally present to a Scouter prior to receiving the District Award of Merit.

District Award of Merit

The District Award of Merit is a council award presented by districts in the same manner that the Silver Beaver is a national award presented by councils. The award is available to Scouters who render service of an outstanding nature at the district level. The award is made available annually to two District Scouters. The district need not present all the awards to which it is entitled each year. It is not appropriate to nominate a Scouter who has already received this award. A professional Scouter or other council employee may not receive this award based on employment service. However, a professional Scouter or employee who also serves as a volunteer Scouter may be eligible, based on volunteer service.

Dear BSA Leader:



The National Safe Scouting Committee has fully engaged with the goal of *Becoming the National Leader in Youth Safety* as presented in the *5 Imperatives of the BSA Roadmap*. This letter is to ask you to assist us in our effort.

Over the past century, we have made significant strides in establishing a robust safety culture within Scouting. While we believe our movement is generally safe, we recognize the ongoing need to enhance safety measures and focus on harm prevention.

Given your role as an owner or influencer of our published materials, we kindly request your assistance in disseminating the message of safety in <u>all</u> your print and electronic publications. To achieve this, we propose the following actions as you edit or prepare various materials:

- Coursework Syllabi: Include a focus on safety by incorporating Safety Moments
 (https://www.scouting.org/health-and-safety/safety-moments/) at the beginning of each session or activity. While over 100 safety moments are available, course leaders may create activity-specific safety moments as needed to make the moment more relevant to participants.
- 2. **Printed Materials:** In all handbooks, syllabi, pamphlets, and other printed materials, we ask you to prominently feature the one-page SAFE information sheet (www.scouting.org/health-and-safety/safe/). Ideally, this information should be placed in the front cover or on a flyleaf. Examples of our preferred location and appearance can be found in recent editions of the Handbook for Officers and Advisers (oa-bsa.org) or the ShootingSportsManual.pdf (scouting.org), which both display the checklist, use the logo, and present the material in the initial pages of the document.
- 3. **Resource Listings:** Include the *Guide to Safe Scouting* (https://www.scouting.org/health-and-safety/gss/) in printed materials where resources are listed. This will draw attention to the *Guide*, emphasizing its importance as a key BSA resource.
- 4. **Program Planning Materials:** For materials intended for program planning, such as Troop or Den Meeting Planning Forms and Annual program planning conference guidance, incorporate references to SAFE, Safety Moments, and the *Guide to Safe Scouting*. Pay special attention to highlighting prohibited activities and age-appropriate activities as well as incident reporting and risk assessment.

We appreciate your collaboration in spreading the SAFE Scouting message. Your support is crucial in ensuring the continued safety and well-being of our youth within the Scouting community.

Thank you for your dedication to the principles of Scouting.


